Though 250,000 patients suffer the debilitating effects of advanced heart failure, only 2,000 heart transplants are performed each year.

The VAD, or Ventricular Assist Device, is a surgically implanted mechanical pump that helps circulate blood to the rest of the body.

VADs dramatically increase survival rates and quality of life.

VADs are miraculous but imperfect, so patients & caregivers must spend

within 60 miles of the hospital where they're being treated for outpatient, post-op care. If they do not agree to incur the costs of relocating during this time, they will **NOT** receive the VAD.

Our Story

Sometimes life takes an unthinkable turn. I learned this first hand when my father was diagnosed with sudden advanced heart failure and our family was thrown headfirst into a terrifying new world of hospitals, medical procedures and statistics. After a few long weeks in the hospital, my dad's team determined that he needed a Ventricular Assist Device. The VAD is imperfect and complex, but a medical marvel nonetheless. It is, quite simply, a game changer for a family battling advanced heart failure.



The Beretta Family

After he received the VAD, my dad started making huge improvements. As he got increasingly more stable we started to relax a bit and observe what was happening around us. We started asking the nursing staff questions and discovered the litany of obstacles the majority of VAD families experience. It's easy to get tunnel vision in a crisis, and to be honest we weren't looking for a moment of perspective, but it just wasn't possible to ignore the heavy burden these precious families carried.



Our lives took a tragic turn in July of 2016 when Papa had a series of unforeseen complications we were unable to overcome. After he passed, our family was faced with a choice. Should we forget what we'd seen and leave the world of heart failure and VADs behind us? **Or might it be possible to take a story about heartbreak and turn it into one about hope?** My father was famously generous and hospitable. Shocked into action, we decided to honor his memory by standing in the gap for patients and families in desperate need of peace, hope and rest. *-Gabrielle Beretta Shepherd*

Our Mission: To meet the practical needs of advanced heart failure patients & their families.

But what does that actually **mean**?

The most common need we're asked to address is lack of local housing, but there are **so many** other barriers that prevent patients from being able to experience good health. We have an opportunity to offer a better outcome, and it's oftentimes through comparatively small acts of kindness.



Prior to Jerome's heart failure, his wife Amy had never driven a car. We paid for Amy's driving lessons so she could get a license and safely transport Jerome back and forth to his appointments.

Debbie and Jeffrey made big sacrifices in order to pay their bills throughout Jeffrey's treatment, but they just weren't able to work the high cost of healthy groceries into their budget. We provided them with gift cards to support the heart healthy diet Jeffrey needed for his recovery.





Bobby lives in Northeast Tennessee and was having trouble coming up with gas money to make it to Nashville for his bimonthly checkups. We were able to provide his family with gas cards so they didn't have to miss any appointments and risk a setback in his health.

When Ms. Johnson became the primary caregiver for her son, Bernard, she knew the space she was preparing for him in her home wouldn't work. Bernard's room had no air conditioning, and the harsh heat of summer was set to make life with an LVAD unbearable. We purchased a unit for Bernard's room so he could have a comfortable place to rest and get stronger.

My name is Mike Avery, I'm 56 years old. I had heart failure and about two years ago everything just went downhill. My heart doctor in Chattanooga said there was nothing else he could do, so he sent me to Vanderbilt. He said Mike, you probably won't make it back if you go home. I finally got the LVAD and it was a blessing to me. I got to where I could breathe again.

Thank goodness for y'all helping us out with a place to stay because I don't know what we would do without it. When you get paid once a month it's hard to pay your bills at home, much less pay everything here. We just didn't know what we were gonna do.

It's devastating. You've got a family to feed. You can't work. It takes everything you've got to get through it. You wonder if you're better off to just go on and not be a burden. It about takes the manhood out of you. Without people like y'all, people like us are gonna die. The Joe Beretta Foundation is saving lives.

Holiday Outreach

One of the primary objectives of The Joe Beretta Foundation is to come alongside patients and families in difficult moments and remind them that they're not alone or forgotten. We provide gifts or meals for all inpatient families on Valentine's Day, Easter, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Thanksgiving, and all celebrations observed during the holiday season.



Emergency Housing Our Emergency Housing program allows us to cover the cost of temporary lodging for families who would otherwise face rejection from the VAD program for financial reasons.



Hospital Visitation Team

We launched our hospital visitation team in an effort to provide support to patients walking through the difficult journey of in-patient treatment. We serve patients in both the Nashville, TN and Pittsburgh, PA areas and have a rotating schedule of volunteers that meet with patients and caregivers every week in their hospital room. They serve as a resource, meet small practical needs and offer conversation that isn't medically driven but rather focuses on how they're doing as a person. When you're in the middle of a crisis, there's something so special about having someone listen compassionately and stand in your corner. Our team does just that and more!

Comfort Bags

Most patients experiencing advanced heart failure are far from home and all are in critical health. The emotional and physical toll this takes on a family cannot be understated. We offer families comfort bags to assist in their adjustment to life in the hospital. Bags often include a warm blanket, travel and card games, toiletries, healthy snacks, and other comforts of home.



Short Term Financial Assistance We're available to meet a number of

additional needs for patients in dire financial situations. We gift gas cards, pay utility bills, connect clients with resources in their hometown for further assistance, and more.
